


Leacock Medal Shortlist Revealed

The Board of Directors of the Leacock Associates today announced its 2017 shortlist of books in the running for the 70th Anniversary Leacock Memorial Medal for Humour award.

The readers and judges chose the three top books from a longlist of 11 after thoroughly evaluating 68 original submissions.

The shortlist for the 2017 Leacock Medal (in alphabetical order by author surname) is:

<u>Gary Barwin</u> for <u>Yiddish for Pirates</u>, Random House Canada.
